The city hearing examiner has to allow these changes. in late May or early June.</p> <p>Neighbors represented by an Ad Hoc group, including Gina Bloom. Jason Roberts. Both mentioned the issue of trust and the need for the community to be actively involved in the planning process.</p> <p>Michael Cervay, representing the MWCC, reported on the history of the school and the changes over the years. Recounted some of the neighbors' s frustrations and the inefficiency of the city in helping the community resolve their issues. Recommendation that MWCC not take a position.</p>
